- ¹ Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to the strangers scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia,
- <sup>2</sup> Elect according to the <u>foreknowledge</u> of God the Father, through <u>sanctification</u> of the <u>Spirit</u>, unto <u>obedience</u> and <u>sprinkling</u> of the <u>blood</u> of <u>Jesus Christ</u>: <u>Grace</u> unto you, and <u>peace</u>, be <u>multiplied</u>.
- <sup>3</sup> <u>Blessed</u> be the <u>God</u> and <u>Father</u> of our <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u>, which according to his <u>abundant mercy</u> hath <u>begotten</u> us <u>again</u> unto a <u>lively hope</u> by the <u>resurrection</u> of <u>Jesus Christ</u> from the <u>dead</u>,
- 4 To an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you,
- 5 Who are **kept** by the **power** of **God** through **faith** unto **salvation** ready to be **revealed** in the <u>last time</u>.
- Wherein ye *greatly* <u>rejoice</u>, though now for a <u>season</u>, if need be, ye are in <u>heaviness</u> through <u>manifold</u> <u>temptations</u>:
- That the <u>trial</u> of your <u>faith</u>, being <u>much more precious</u> than of <u>gold</u> that <u>perisheth</u>, though it be <u>tried</u> with <u>fire</u>, might be <u>found</u> unto <u>praise</u> and <u>honour</u> and <u>glory</u> at the <u>appearing</u> of <u>Jesus Christ</u>:
- Whom having <u>not seen</u>, ye <u>love</u>; in whom, though now ye <u>see</u> him <u>not</u>, yet <u>believing</u>, ye <u>rejoice</u> with <u>joy unspeakable</u> and <u>full</u> of <u>glory</u>:
- 9 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.
- 10 Of which <u>salvation</u> the <u>prophets</u> have <u>enquired</u> and <u>searched</u> <u>diligently</u>, who <u>prophesied</u> of the <u>grace</u> that should come unto you:
- 11 Searching what, or what manner of time the **Spirit** of **Christ** which was in them did <u>signify</u>, when it <u>testified</u> beforehand the <u>sufferings</u> of **Christ**, and the <u>glory</u> that should <u>follow</u>.
- 12 Unto whom it was <u>revealed</u>, that <u>not</u> unto themselves, but unto us they did <u>minister</u> the <u>things</u>, which are now <u>reported</u> unto you by them that have <u>preached</u> the <u>gospel</u> unto you with the <u>Holy Ghost sent</u> down from <u>heaven</u>; which things the <u>angels desire</u> to look into.
- 13 Wherefore gird *up* the <u>loins</u> of your <u>mind</u>, be <u>sober</u>, and <u>hope</u> to the <u>end</u> for the <u>grace</u> that is to be brought unto you at the <u>revelation</u> of <u>Jesus Christ</u>;
- 14 As obedient children, not fashioning yourselves according to the former lusts in your ignorance:
- <sup>15</sup> But as he which hath <u>called</u> you is <u>holy</u>, so be ye *holy* in *all* manner of <u>conversation</u>;
- <sup>16</sup> Because it is <u>written</u>, Be ye <u>holy</u>; for I am *holy*.

- 17 And if ye <u>call</u> on the **Father**, who without <u>respect</u> of <u>persons judgeth</u> according to <u>every man's work</u>, <u>pass</u> the <u>time</u> of your <u>sojourning</u> here in <u>fear</u>:
- 18 Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers;
- 19 But with the *precious* blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:
- 20 Who *verily* was *foreordained* before the <u>foundation</u> of the <u>world</u>, but was <u>manifest</u> in these <u>last times</u> for you,
- 21 Who by him do <u>believe</u> in **God**, that <u>raised</u> him *up* from the <u>dead</u>, and gave him <u>glory</u>; that your <u>faith</u> and <u>hope</u> might be in **God**.
- 22 Seeing ye have <u>purified</u> your <u>souls</u> in <u>obeying</u> the <u>truth</u> through the <u>Spirit</u> unto <u>unfeigned love</u> of the brethren, see that ye <u>love</u> one another with a <u>pure heart</u> <u>fervently</u>.
- 23 Being <u>born again</u>, <u>not</u> of <u>corruptible seed</u>, but of <u>incorruptible</u>, by the <u>word</u> of <u>God</u>, which <u>liveth</u> and <u>abideth for ever</u>.
- 24 For *all* <u>flesh</u> is as <u>grass</u>, and *all* the <u>glory</u> of <u>man</u> as the <u>flower</u> of grass. The grass <u>withereth</u>, and the flower thereof <u>falleth away</u>:
- <sup>25</sup> But the word of the Lord endureth for ever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you.

- Wherefore <u>laying aside all malice</u>, and <u>all guile</u>, and <u>hypocrisies</u>, and <u>envies</u>, <u>all evil</u> speakings,
- 2 As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby:
- If so be ye have <u>tasted</u> that the <u>Lord</u> is <u>gracious</u>.
- 4 To whom coming, as unto a *living* stone, <u>disallowed</u> indeed of <u>men</u>, but <u>chosen</u> of **God**, and <u>precious</u>,
- 5 Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ.
- Wherefore *also* it is <u>contained</u> in the <u>scripture</u>, Behold, I <u>lay</u> in <u>Sion</u> a <u>chief corner stone</u>, <u>elect</u>, <u>precious</u>: and he that <u>believeth</u> on him shall not be confounded.
- Tunto you therefore which <u>believe</u> he is <u>precious</u>: but unto them which be <u>disobedient</u>, the <u>stone</u> which the <u>builders disallowed</u>, the same is made the <u>head</u> of the <u>corner</u>,
- 8 And a <u>stone</u> of <u>stumbling</u>, and a <u>rock</u> of <u>offence</u>, even to them which <u>stumble</u> at the <u>word</u>, being <u>disobedient</u>: whereunto <u>also</u> they were <u>appointed</u>.
- But ye are a *chosen* <u>generation</u>, a *royal* <u>priesthood</u>, an *holy* <u>nation</u>, a *peculiar* people; that ye should shew forth the <u>praises</u> of him who hath <u>called</u> you *out* of <u>darkness</u> into his *marvellous* <u>light</u>;
- 10 Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy.
- <sup>11</sup> Dearly beloved, I <u>beseech</u> you as <u>strangers</u> and <u>pilgrims</u>, <u>abstain</u> from <u>fleshly lusts</u>, which <u>war against</u> the <u>soul</u>;
- <sup>12</sup> Having your <u>conversation</u> honest among the Gentiles: that, whereas they speak <u>against</u> you as <u>evildoers</u>, they may by your <u>good works</u>, which they shall behold, <u>glorify</u> God in the <u>day</u> of <u>visitation</u>.
- <sup>13</sup> Submit yourselves to every ordinance of man for the Lord's sake: whether it be to the king, as supreme;
- 14 Or unto governors, as unto them that are sent by him for the punishment of evildoers, and for the praise of them that do well.
- 15 For so is the will of God, that with well doing ye may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men:
- 16 As <u>free</u>, and <u>not</u> using your <u>liberty</u> for a <u>cloke</u> of <u>maliciousness</u>, but as the <u>servants</u> of <u>God</u>.
- 17 Honour all men. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the king.

- Servants, be subject to your masters with all fear; not only to the good and gentle, but also to the froward.
- 19 For this is thankworthy, if a man for conscience toward God endure grief, suffering wrongfully.
- 20 For what glory is it, if, when ye be <u>buffeted</u> for your <u>faults</u>, ye shall take it <u>patiently</u>? but if, when ye do <u>well</u>, and <u>suffer</u> for it, ye take it <u>patiently</u>, this is <u>acceptable</u> with **God**.
- 21 For even hereunto were ye <u>called</u>: because **Christ** *also* <u>suffered</u> for us, <u>leaving</u> us an <u>example</u>, that ye should <u>follow</u> his <u>steps</u>:
- 22 Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth:
- 23 Who, when he was <u>reviled</u>, reviled <u>not again</u>; when he <u>suffered</u>, he <u>threatened not</u>; but <u>committed</u> himself to him that <u>judgeth</u> <u>righteously</u>.
- 24 Who his *own self* bare our sins in his *own* body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.
- 25 For ye were as sheep going astray; but are now returned unto the Shepherd and Bishop of your souls.

- Likewise, ye <u>wives</u>, be in <u>subjection</u> to your *own* <u>husbands</u>; that, if <u>any obey not</u> the <u>word</u>, they <u>also</u> may without the word be <u>won</u> by the <u>conversation</u> of the wives;
- While they behold your chaste conversation coupled with fear.
- Whose <u>adorning</u> let it <u>not</u> be that <u>outward</u> adorning of <u>plaiting</u> the <u>hair</u>, and of <u>wearing</u> of <u>gold</u>, or of <u>putting</u> on of <u>apparel</u>;
- But let it be the *hidden* man of the <u>heart</u>, in that which is <u>not corruptible</u>, even the <u>ornament</u> of a *meek* and *quiet* <u>spirit</u>, which is in the <u>sight</u> of **God** of *great* <u>price</u>.
- For *after* this <u>manner</u> in the *old* <u>time</u> the *holy* <u>women</u> also, who <u>trusted</u> in <u>God</u>, <u>adorned</u> themselves, being in subjection unto their *own* husbands:
- <sup>6</sup> Even as Sara <u>obeyed</u> Abraham, calling him <u>lord</u>: whose daughters ye are, as long as ye do <u>well</u>, and are <u>not afraid</u> with <u>any amazement</u>.
- TLikewise, ye <u>husbands</u>, <u>dwell</u> with them according to <u>knowledge</u>, giving <u>honour</u> unto the <u>wife</u>, as unto the <u>weaker vessel</u>, and as being <u>heirs</u> together of the <u>grace</u> of <u>life</u>; that your <u>prayers</u> be <u>not hindered</u>.
- Finally, be ye all of <u>one mind</u>, having <u>compassion</u> one of another, <u>love</u> as brethren, be <u>pitiful</u>, be <u>courteous</u>:
- <sup>9</sup> Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing. but contrariwise blessing; knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing.
- 10 For he that will <u>love life</u>, and see *good* <u>days</u>, let him <u>refrain</u> his <u>tongue</u> from <u>evil</u>, and his <u>lips</u> that they speak <u>no guile</u>:
- 11 Let him <u>eschew evil</u>, and do <u>good</u>; let him <u>seek peace</u>, and <u>ensue</u> it.
- 12 For the <u>eyes</u> of the **Lord** are *over* the <u>righteous</u>, and his <u>ears</u> are <u>open</u> unto their <u>prayers</u>: but the <u>face</u> of the **Lord** is <u>against</u> them that do <u>evil</u>.
- 13 And who is he that will <u>harm</u> you, if ye be <u>followers</u> of that which is <u>good</u>?
- 14 But and if ye <u>suffer</u> for <u>righteousness'</u> sake, <u>happy</u> are ye: and be <u>not afraid</u> of their <u>terror</u>, <u>neither</u> be <u>troubled</u>;
- 15 But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear:

- <sup>16</sup> Having a good conscience; that, whereas they speak evil of you, as of evildoers, they may be ashamed that falsely accuse your good conversation in Christ.
- 17 For it is *better*, if the <u>will</u> of **God** be so, that ye <u>suffer</u> for <u>well</u> doing, than for <u>evil</u> doing.
- <sup>18</sup> For Christ also hath once <u>suffered</u> for <u>sins</u>, the <u>just</u> for the <u>unjust</u>, that he might bring us to <u>God</u>, being <u>put</u> to <u>death</u> in the <u>flesh</u>, but <u>quickened</u> by the <u>Spirit</u>:
- 19 By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison;
- 20 Which <u>sometime</u> were <u>disobedient</u>, when once the <u>longsuffering</u> of <u>God waited</u> in the <u>days</u> of <u>Noah</u>, while the <u>ark</u> was a <u>preparing</u>, wherein few, that is, <u>eight souls</u> were <u>saved</u> by <u>water</u>.
- 21 The like <u>figure</u> whereunto even <u>baptism</u> doth also now <u>save</u> us (<u>not</u> the <u>putting away</u> of the <u>filth</u> of the <u>flesh</u>, but the answer of a <u>good conscience</u> <u>toward God</u>,) by the <u>resurrection</u> of <u>Jesus Christ</u>:
- 22 Who is gone into <u>heaven</u>, and is on the <u>right hand</u> of <u>God</u>; <u>angels</u> and <u>authorities</u> and <u>powers</u> being made <u>subject</u> unto him.

- ¹ Forasmuch then as Christ hath <u>suffered</u> for us in the <u>flesh</u>, <u>arm</u> yourselves likewise with the <u>same mind</u>: for he that hath suffered in the flesh hath <u>ceased</u> from <u>sin</u>;
- 2 That he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God.
- <sup>3</sup> For the <u>time</u> *past* of our <u>life</u> may <u>suffice</u> us to have <u>wrought</u> the <u>will</u> of the <u>Gentiles</u>, when we <u>walked</u> in <u>lasciviousness</u>, <u>lusts</u>, <u>excess</u> of <u>wine</u>, <u>revellings</u>, <u>banquetings</u>, and <u>abominable idolatries</u>:
- 4 Wherein they think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot, speaking evil of you:
- 5 Who shall give account to him that is ready to judge the quick and the dead.
- For for this <u>cause</u> was the <u>gospel preached</u> <u>also</u> to them that are <u>dead</u>, that they might be <u>judged</u> according to <u>men</u> in the <u>flesh</u>, but <u>live</u> according to <u>God</u> in the <u>spirit</u>.
- 7 But the <u>end</u> of <u>all things</u> is at <u>hand</u>: be ye therefore <u>sober</u>, and <u>watch</u> unto <u>prayer</u>.
- 8 And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.
- 9 Use <u>hospitality</u> one to another without <u>grudging</u>.
- 10 As <u>every man</u> hath <u>received</u> the <u>gift</u>, even so <u>minister</u> the same one to another, as <u>good stewards</u> of the <u>manifold grace</u> of God.
- <sup>11</sup> If any man speak, let him speak as the <u>oracles</u> of God; if any man <u>minister</u>, let him do it as of the <u>ability</u> which God giveth: that God in all things may be <u>glorified</u> through Jesus Christ, to whom be <u>praise</u> and <u>dominion</u> for ever and ever. Amen.
- <sup>12</sup> Beloved, think it <u>not strange</u> concerning the <u>fiery trial</u> which is to <u>try</u> you, as though some <u>strange thing</u> <u>happened</u> unto you:
- 13 But <u>rejoice</u>, inasmuch as ye are <u>partakers</u> of <u>Christ's sufferings</u>; that, when his <u>glory</u> shall be <u>revealed</u>, ye may be <u>glad</u> <u>also</u> with <u>exceeding joy</u>.
- 14 If ye be <u>reproached</u> for the <u>name</u> of <u>Christ</u>, <u>happy</u> are ye; for the <u>spirit</u> of <u>glory</u> and of <u>God resteth</u> upon you: on their part he is <u>evil</u> spoken of, but on your part he is <u>glorified</u>.
- 15 But let <u>none</u> of you <u>suffer</u> as a <u>murderer</u>, or as a <u>thief</u>, or as an <u>evildoer</u>, or as a <u>busybody</u> in <u>other</u> men's matters.
- 16 Yet if any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on this behalf.

- 17 For the time is come that judgment must begin at the house of God: and if it first begin at us, what shall the end be of them that obey not the gospel of God?
- 18 And if the <u>righteous</u> scarcely be <u>saved</u>, where shall the <u>ungodly</u> and the <u>sinner appear?</u>
- <sup>19</sup> Wherefore let them that <u>suffer</u> according to the <u>will</u> of <u>God commit</u> the <u>keeping</u> of their <u>souls</u> to him in <u>well</u> doing, as unto a *faithful* Creator.

- ¹ The <u>elders</u> which are among you I <u>exhort</u>, who am <u>also</u> an <u>elder</u>, and a <u>witness</u> of the <u>sufferings</u> of <u>Christ</u>, and also a <u>partaker</u> of the <u>glory</u> that shall be <u>revealed</u>:
- <sup>2</sup> <u>Feed</u> the <u>flock</u> of <u>God</u> which is among you, taking the <u>oversight</u> thereof, <u>not</u> by <u>constraint</u>, but <u>willingly</u>, <u>not</u> for <u>filthy lucre</u>, but of a <u>ready mind</u>;
- Neither as being <u>lords</u> over <u>God's heritage</u>, but being <u>examples</u> to the <u>flock</u>.
- <sup>4</sup> And when the <u>chief</u> Shepherd shall <u>appear</u>, ye shall <u>receive</u> a <u>crown</u> of <u>glory</u> that fadeth <u>not away</u>.
- 5 Likewise, ye <u>younger</u>, <u>submit</u> yourselves unto the <u>elder</u>. Yea, *all* of you be <u>subject</u> one to another, and be <u>clothed</u> with <u>humility</u>: for <u>God resisteth</u> the <u>proud</u>, and giveth <u>grace</u> to the <u>humble</u>.
- 6 Humble yourselves therefore *under* the *mighty* hand of God, that he may exalt you in *due* time:
- <sup>7</sup> Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.
- Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:
- 9 Whom <u>resist stedfast</u> in the <u>faith</u>, <u>knowing</u> that the same <u>afflictions</u> are <u>accomplished</u> in your brethren that are in the world.
- 10 But the God of all grace, who hath <u>called</u> us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have <u>suffered</u> a while, make you <u>perfect</u>, <u>stablish</u>, <u>strengthen</u>, <u>settle</u> you.
- 11 To him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.
- 12 By Silvanus, a <u>faithful</u> brother unto you, as I <u>suppose</u>, I have <u>written</u> <u>briefly</u>, <u>exhorting</u>, and <u>testifying</u> that this is the <u>true grace</u> of God wherein ye <u>stand</u>.
- 13 The <u>church</u> that is at **Babylon**, <u>elected</u> together with you, <u>saluteth</u> you; and so doth **Marcus** my son.
- 14 Greet ye one another with a kiss of charity. Peace be with you all that are in Christ Jesus. Amen.
